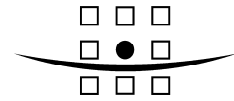

Haagse Hogeschool wins NET Trophy 2009

The NET Trophy is an initiative of the Ministry of Housing and the Environment in The Netherlands and is THE annual national prize for the sustainable living and working environment. It is granted for the organisation that excels in a sustainable approach to a project or initiative. Royal Haskoning was responsible for the architecture and the structural design and implementation of this extraordinary building. The Haagse Hogeschool was one of the nominees.

The Haagse Hogeschool built a new extension in Delft, 'the most sustainable vocational education building in the Netherlands'. Water pumps, collectors in the roads and carpark, low-energy lighting and an innovative building services system that regulates energy demand are responsible for an enormous saving of the annual energy costs: approx. 55,000 euro. The CO2 reduction is 65%.
